Do not pass the anti-state, anti-European and Pro-Russian law!

We, persons with disabilities and their representatives, strongly oppose the bill on the Transparency of the Foreign Influence initiated in the Parliament of Georgia.

The Above mentioned bill, if passed into law, will jeopardize not only the ]non-governmental organizations, the media and civil society, but the whole population at large including persons with disabilities. It will prevent the critical opinions existing within the disability community from making appearance, as despite the fact that Georgia has ratified the United Nations Convention of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities/UNCRPD, civic and political participation of persons with disabilities and their representatives is not ensured by the state.

The above mentioned disability community is strongly connected to the civil society supported by the international donors. It has been evident that the non-governmental organizations have mostly contributed to the employment of persons with disabilities. They are the main source of information and an Ally of the disability community in advocating for the support services we need. Thanks to the international support, Georgia has ratified the UNCRPD, established the consultative mechanisms for persons with disabilities to contribute to the state decision-making with different public entities, has introduced inclusive education into public school system, created various educational programs for persons with disabilities free of charge.

If the bill on the Transparency of the Foreign Influence is passed into a law, we will be deprived of the vital support services, will be prevented from full and successful integration and political participation in the society, our autonomy and independent living will be stoled and human rights situation worsened. This law will endanger Georgia's European aspirations, which, together with living in a democratic state, have no alternative for persons with disabilities.

You, the Georgian legislators, have the obligation to respect our needs and interests and withhold your support from the above mentioned harmful, Russian bill!
